#### NC FIT

- The Formerly Incarcerated Transition (FIT) program utilizes community health workers to connect recent released or soon to be released individuals with a chronic illness to include, chronic medical conditions, mental health, and/or substance use disorders to providers within the community.

# COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER



Individuals are assigned a Community Health Worker to assist with:

- Navigating systems pertaining their physical and mental health, and substance use disorders.
- Linkage to resources to assist w/ housing, food, clothing, employment, etc.
- Provide support and encouragement during transition that support a holistic approach while supporting the goals identified by the individual.





#### Eligibility

- 18 yrs old or older
- Wake County Resident Or reside in one of our serving counties (Wake, Durham, Orange, Mecklenburg, Guilford, New Hanover)
- Released from Incarceration within 2 years of the referral date.

- Individuals can visit Oak City Cares Mondays & Wednesday 10am-12pm during walk-in hours for self – referrals.

#### NC FIT RECOVERY



- FIT Recovery is designed to connect individuals with an opioid use disorder during reentry by connecting them with Medication Assistant Treatment (MAT).
- Appointments are scheduled prior to release along with the support of the community health worker upon release.
- Goal Decrease overdoses for individuals during reentry leading to lower mortality rates utilizing supportive services.





#### Eligibility

- 18yrs or older
- Resident in one of our serving counties (Wake, Durham, Orange, Mecklenburg, Guilford, New Hanover)
- Addicted to an Opioid
- Must be referred 3-6 months before being released from incarceration

#### REFERRAL PROCESS

- ONLY ACCEPTING STATE FEDERAL CORRECCTIONAL INSTITUTION REFERRALS
- Must be referred by the social worker- case manager completing home plan
- Must have diagnosed Opioid Use Disorder.






- FIT Wellness serve the Severe Mentally III (SMI) by connecting them with psychiatric and primary care services upon release.
- NC FIT Wellness participants are assigned a Community Health Worker (CHW) who provides supportive services, linkage to resources, and assistance with navigating systems within the community.
- ❖ In addition, individuals are provided TracFone's, assistance with clothing, food, medications, medical supplies, etc.

### NC FIT WELLNESS PROGRAM

#### Eligibility

- > 18yrs or older
- Releasing to Wake County
- Diagnosed with a Severe Mental Illness
- Incarcerated at the time of Referral





NC FIT Wellness accept referrals for individuals referred from state and federal prisons and Wake County Detention Center who has a diagnosed Serious Mental Illness (SMI). Ex; Schizophrenia, Schizoaffective, Bipolar type 1, etc.

- Must be referred from a State Federal Correctional Institution Wake County Jail.
- Must be referred while incarcerated by social worker case manager completing home plan

# BENEFITS OF MEDICAID EXPANSION



- \* Healthcare made affordable for client population.
- \* Covers most medical expenses with small co-pays.
- Income-based for individuals who cannot afford insurance.
- \* Covers eye care and dental.
- No deductibles No monthly premiums.

#### Continued...

- Medicaid made available to adults aged 18-64.
- Section 1115 Reentry Waiver allows individuals to enroll in Medicaid 90 days prior to release from prison.
- ❖ 1 year Verification process following enrollment.
- Eligible despite criminal hx employment status
  income.
- Covers Psychiatric Services, SA Tx, Therapy Counseling, etc.
