

Voter Landscape of NRP Rural Counties by Race




~56,000 Registered Voters of Color Didn't Vote in November 2020


NC Supreme Court seat was decided by **401 Votes out of 5 million cast**

Outreach Key Factors

Partnerships with local trusted organizations, community leaders Local healthcare agencies/providers Incentives: Free food, raffle drawing, give-aways Value adds: children's services, Voter ID, employment services Marketing: flyers, social media, churches, schools, local partners, day-of activities Traditional GOTV methods (i.e., Canvassing)
