

Introductory Poll Questions





- As of December 1, 2023, approximately 600,000 North Carolinians are newly eligible for Medicaid under the expansion.
 - Medicaid income requirements are being expanded to include adults ages 19-64 earning up to 138 percent of the Federal Poverty Line.
- Medicaid pays for doctor visits, yearly check-ups, emergency care, mental health and more with no premiums or deductibles and a copay of \$4 for some services.
 - Medicaid Family Planning beneficiaries under 139% FPL have been auto-mapped onto full Medicaid as of December 1st- some may not be aware that they have full Medicaid






FFM Determination State

- As of February 1st, 2024, NC has become a Federally-Facilitated Marketplace determination state
- This means that Healthcare.gov can **determine** an individual to be eligible for Medicaid, rather than assessing their eligibility for Medicaid \circ In many cases, the application is still transferred to the state to make the final decision for the category of Medicaid, and the state may request more information.

"It's official! Tailored Plans will launch on July 1. At a legislative committee hearing today, NC Medicaid shared that the Local Management Entities (LMEs) that will run Tailored Plans – Alliance Health, Partners Health Management, Trillium Health Resources, and Vaya Health – are all ready to go live. As always, we are committed to being ready to serve and care for North Carolinians that use these services.

Tailored Plans include services for people with serious mental health issues, substance use issues, intellectual and developmental disabilities, and traumatic brain injury. People with NC Medicaid Direct who receive services for these needs may be moved to a Tailored Plan. The name will change, but the services will not.

Later this month, we'll be sending you a toolkit to share with your networks so that people know what to expect with the launch of Tailored Plans."

Prescription Copays

- Beneficiaries being unable to afford copays: "Under 42 C.F.R. 447.52(e)(2) providers are generally prohibited from denying "services to an eligible individual on account of the individual's inability to pay the cost sharing."
- This means patients should not be denied service based on an inability to pay.
- Please keep reporting any occurrences in which a beneficiary is denied service based on an inability to pay so we can share that with the state.

Prescription Copays

5.5 Co-payments

5.5.1 Medicaid Co-payment Requirements

An eligible Medicaid beneficiary, who receives prescribed drugs, is required to make a co-payment of \$4.00 for each prescription received unless they are exempt for one of the reasons listed below in **Subsection 5.5.2**. A provider may not deny services to any Medicaid beneficiary because of the individual's inability to pay a deductible, coinsurance or co-payment amount. A provider may not willfully discount copays for a Medicaid beneficiary, and an individual's inability to pay does not eliminate his or her liability for the cost sharing charge. The provider shall open an account for the beneficiary, collect the amount owed at a later date, and document all attempts to collect the copay. If the account has not been paid, the pharmacy may in the course of normal accounting principles, write-off the charges and stop monitoring the claim.

5.5.2 Co-payment Exemptions for a Medicaid beneficiary

A Medicaid beneficiary following:

- a. The beneficiary is under 21 years of age;
- b. The beneficiary resides in a nursing home facility, Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IID) or a mental health hospital;
- c. Adult care home and hospice beneficiaries are responsible for co-payment.
- d. The drug is classified as family planning (birth control medication). Exemption from the co-pay for family planning drugs is indicated on the drug file and does not require any additional indicators. Do not collect a co-pay for oral contraceptives;
- e. The beneficiary is classified as a CAP beneficiary as indicated on the beneficiary's Medicaid Identification Card (MID card);
- f. The beneficiary is pregnant. The co-payment exemption is made automatically by the claims processing system for an eligible beneficiary. In the event that the system does not override the copay, the pharmacy may use any of the ICD-10-CM codes listed in **Attachment J** to indicate pregnancy; or
- g. A "4" in the Prior Authorization Type Code or a "2" in the pregnancy indicator field on a point-of-sale (POS) claim also indicates an exemption from the co-payment deduction for pregnancy.
- h. The beneficiary is a member of a federally recognized tribe.



A Medicaid beneficiary is exempt from a co-payment for any one of the
